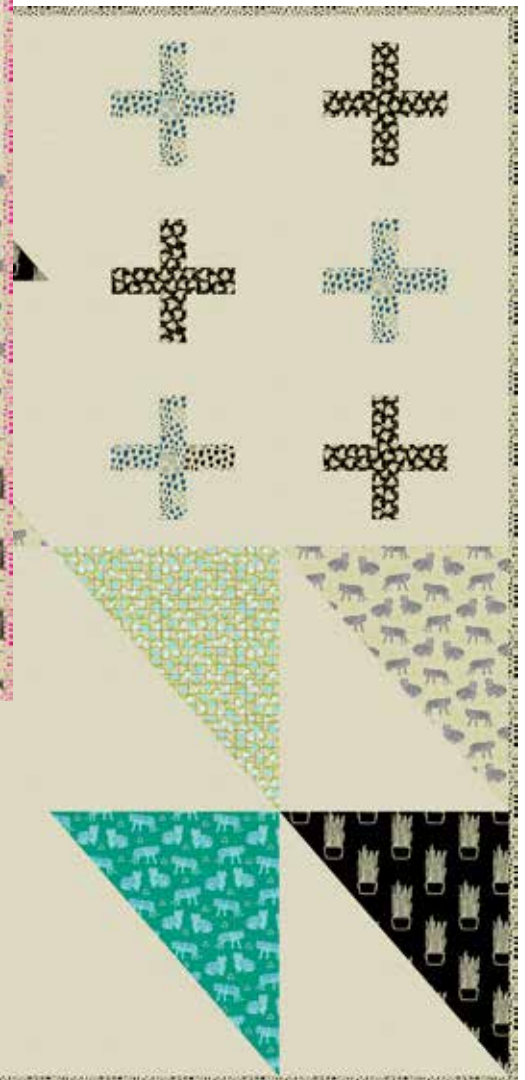

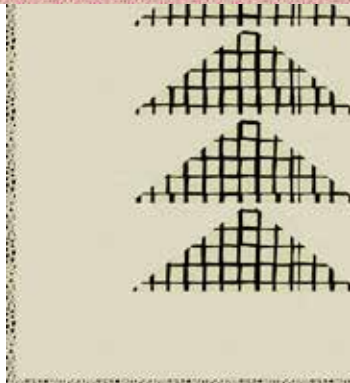

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# Tiger Plant Quilt



Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: **TIGER PLANT** by Sarah Golden

Quilt designed by Sarah Golden

Quilt finishes 52" x 60"

8 Block X: 13" x 15"

6 Block Y: 10" x 10"

4 Block Z: 5" x 13"

*An interesting combination of floral prints, tigers, and abstract geometrics bring a zing to this wall quilt/throw. Over-sized blocks will make quick work of this out-of-the-ordinary design.*

## Cutting Directions

**Note:** Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. A fat  $\frac{1}{8}$  is a 9" x 20"-22" cut of fabric. A fat  $\frac{1}{4}$  is an 18" x 20"-22" cut. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

### Fabric A

Cut (6) strips 2½" x WOF for binding

### Fabric B

Cut (4) Template 1

### Fabric C

Cut (4) rectangles 14" x 16" (Read Step 1.)

Cut (2) strips 5½" x 26½"

Cut (2) strips 7" x 20½"

Cut (3) strips 2½" x 30½"

Cut (12) strips 2" x 10½"

Cut (12) strips 2" x 7½"

Cut (24) squares 3¼" x 3¼"

Cut (4) Template 2

Cut (4) Template 2 Reversed

**2 Fat ⅛'s** From each:

Cut (3) strips 2" x 7½"

Cut (6) rectangles 2" x 3¼"

**4 Fat ¼'s** From each:

Cut (1) rectangle 14" x 16" (Read Step 1.)

### Backing

Cut (2) panels 34" x 60", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

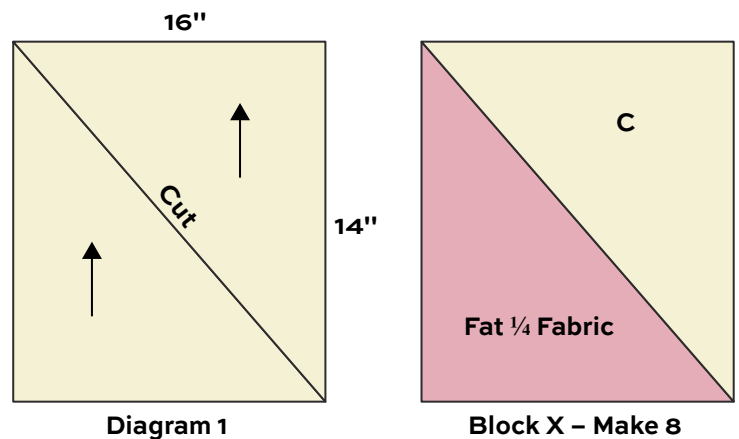

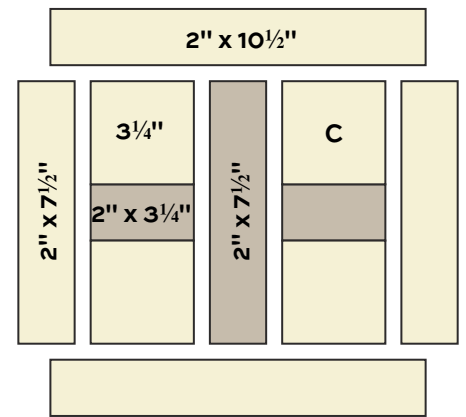
## Making the Quilt

1. Referring to Diagram 1, cut the 4 Fat  $\frac{1}{4}$  and 4 Fabric C 14" x 16" rectangles in half diagonally once in the direction shown, being careful to orient the directional prints as indicated by the arrows. Mark the sewing line on the wrong side of each triangle. Matching marked lines, join a Fabric C triangle with a Fat  $\frac{1}{4}$  triangle to make a Block X. Press seam allowances toward the printed patch. Repeat to make 8 Block X. Trim each block to 13½" x 15½" if needed.

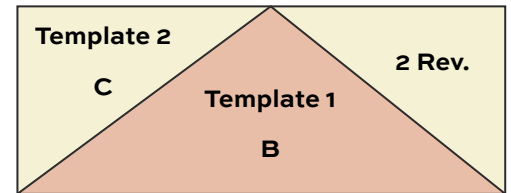

2. Referring to the Block Y diagram, join Fat ¼'s patches with Fabric C patches to make a Block Y. Make 6.
3. Mark the dots on the wrong side of each fabric Template 1, Template 2, and Template 2 Reversed patch. With right sides together and matching dots, sew a Template 2 and a Template 2 Reversed patch to a Template 1 patch to make a Block Z. Press seam allowances toward Template 1. Make 4 Block Z.
4. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, join 4 different Block X in the order shown, keeping directional prints upright, to make the top left quarter of the quilt. Sew the second group of 4 Block X to make the bottom right quarter of the quilt, paying attention to the orientation of the printed triangles.
5. Join 6 Block Y in 2 vertical rows of 3 blocks each. Alternately join the block rows with 3 Fabric C 2½" x 30½" strips.
6. Sew 4 Block Z in a vertical row. Sew Fabric C 7" strips to sides and sew 5½" strips to top and bottom.
7. Join the 4 quarters to make the quilt.



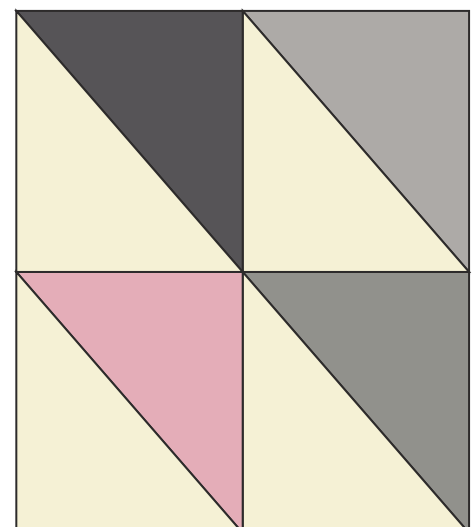
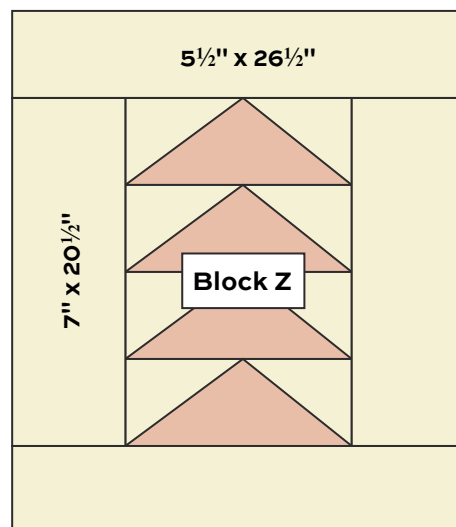
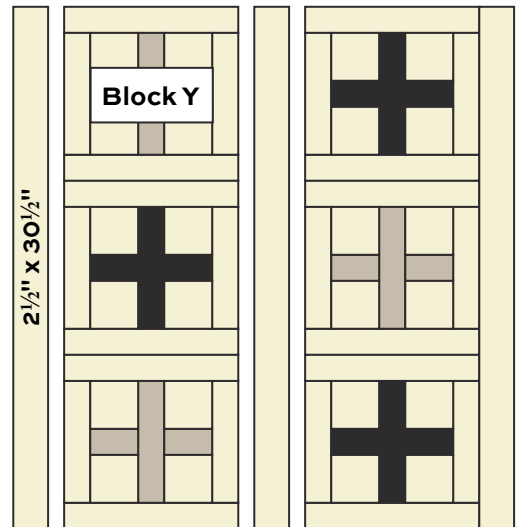
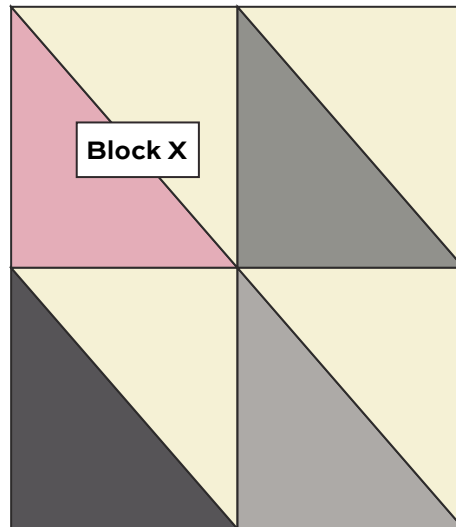
**Block Y – Make 6**

## Finishing the Quilt

8. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the blocks. Bind to finish the quilt.
